Lecture on Alzheimer's disease and neurocognitive disorders with practical tips for visiting someone with the disease. The speaker will provide participants with tips for optimizing time spent with a person with a neurocognitive disorder.

CONFERENCE 4 : CARING FOR THE CAREGIVER

- A discussion about the role of caregivers and how to support them and help reduce their stress.
- Caregivers, family members and friends are welcome.

CONFERENCE 5 : AMBIGUOUS LOSS

- Issues of grief and loss are among the most difficult to deal with when caring for someone with Alzheimer's disease or another neurocognitive disorder. Ambiguous loss differs from loss following a death in that closure is impossible while the person is still alive.
- Fortunately, understanding loss and grief, as well discovering available strategies, can help mitigate the effects of the disease.
