Your role will be...

• Contact the referred person to assess their needs in order to guide them towards the resources best suited to their situation.

During this needs assessment, you might:

- Provide information about Alzheimer's disease, caregiving, and available resources;
- Help the client better understand their own needs or those of the person being cared for;
- Refer the client to our various services;
- Direct the client to other organizations offering the services they are looking for;

And much more.

Your role will also include...

- Respond to inquiries from caregivers, families, and individuals living with neurocognitive disorders (NCDs) via telephone or in-person consultations, according to internal procedures.
- Conduct client needs assessments and follow up at various stages along the service continuum to effectively guide them towards the Society's programs and services or refer them to external partners and resources.
- Document clinical information in the client file using the AlayaCare platform after each intervention, in accordance with the standards established by the Alzheimer Society of Montreal.
- Compile data and produce statistics for reporting purposes.
- Participate in team meetings and collaborate with the Society's internal departments to share relevant information and direct requests to the appropriate resources.
- Organize and lead information sessions for referring professionals to raise awareness of the programs and services offered by the Alzheimer Society of Montreal and the Référence Aidance Québec (RAQ) platform.
